

COURSE PHILOSOPHY

Fundamental Studies - A Core Supplement for All Piano Students

Many piano students — even those with strong technique and natural talent — eventually reach a plateau. What often limits their growth is not their ability to play, but the depth of understanding in what they see, hear, and interpret in music. A common misconception is that theory lessons are only necessary for exam preparation, or something that can simply be "caught up on later."

This course is designed to address that gap. Modeled on the RCM Theory syllabus yet delivered through the Dalcroze approach; it combines movement, ear training and applied theory to engage both the body and mind. The accumulated teaching experience of the instructor further shapes the program, ensuring that concepts are not only learned, but lived.

Students will develop **coordination of the senses**: connecting ear, eye, and hand, while application of knowledge is always stressed. **Our class learning is always done on the piano, not just paper and pencils**. These skills become the bedrock for all future music-making, extending far beyond exam requirements, even beyond RCM Level 10. If you are just looking for some hacks and tips to pass the exams in the shortest time, this is not for you. This is truly beyond preparing students for the exam.

Through reading, listening, movement, and analysis, students gain the tools to understand why phrasing is shaped a certain way, how harmony informs interpretation, and how to cultivate an authentic personal style.

The ultimate goal is simple yet transformative: to instill a foundation that allows students to unlock artistry, confidence, and individuality at the piano — for a lifetime of music-making.



Core topics to cover in each session:

Ear training, sight reading, theory, keyboard skills (chords, scales, arpeggios)

Learning Structure:

- 1. Weekly 50-minute Zoom class.
- 2. Take-home materials (personalized based on the levels of students):
 - 1 theory handout partially personalized
 - 1 listening homework personalized
 - 1 sight reading homework personalized
 - 1 set of quizlet flashcards every 2 weeks same for all
- 3. Video resources (Google drive) will be shared and made available for the entire year
- 4. An assessment report will be provided at the end of each module to assess the progress of students.

Session structure

15 mins - Ear Training: Rhythm / Pitch / Intervals

15 mins - Pitch / Sight Reading

15 mins - Theory

5 min - wrap up
